Weather Impacts: What It Means for You

This Week: Summer's here, but it's business as usual with daily thunderstorm chances, perfect mornings for a quick Venice Beach stroll, but keep an umbrella handy by afternoon or night if you're out in downtown. The rainy season's soaking away the drought, so your garden at home might not need extra watering for once, but watch for muddy spots if you're walking in the parks. Heat's sticking around with no relief, so stay hydrated and seek shade to beat the sun or stick around bodies of water. Night storms might rattle your windows, making it a cozy night for indoor movies, have a flashlight ready just in case. With the tropics quiet we have nothing to worry about for a while! Be sure to check my radar updates for those thunderstorm timings!



Weather Safety

Safety Tip of The Week: During nighttime thunderstorms, avoid standing near windows, lightning strikes can shatter glass. It's best to move to an interior room until the storm passes!

Hurricane Preparedness Tip of the Week: With hurricane season underway, stock a week's worth of prescription meds in your kit. The pharmacies may close just before and after a storm passes, so plan ahead! Source: weather.gov/safety/

Best Beach Day: Any day this week looks pretty good for beach weather. As always, the morning hours seem like the best time to go vs later in the afternoon due to those chances for pop-up showers and thunderstorms each day. Otherwise, I don't see any other significant weather hazards of concern.

Best Boating Day: Offshore you can expect a range of 1 to 3 feet for most of the weekdays, with the best conditions possible by the weekend where 1 foot or less seas are likely at this time! Nearshore boating looks just fine any day with no significant weather hazards of concern.

Best Surf Day: No significant or beginner surf is likely this week at the time of writing this.


