# This Week's Weather

## **Overview**

The big story this week will be how rainy it is expected to be versus last week where we had much less coverage of rain and storms. This will be due to some tropical moisture expected to be present across portions of the state through the week. At the time of writing this any tropical development looks low for now, but I'm always keeping an eye on the tropics this time of year even though the rest of July looks pretty quiet. Temperatures this week will continue to be hot and very humid with dew points continuing to make that air feel very uncomfortable outside. #### Weather Impacts: What It Means for You

This Week: This week's tropical moisture ramps up rain and storms—perfect for skipping Venice Beach swims during afternoon downpours, but great for your garden as the drought continues to fade. Hot temps with muggy dew points mean staying hydrated is key if you're at the Venice Farmer's Market, carry a water bottle and seek shade. Expect some sunny breaks, ideal for a quick walk at a local park, though keep a rain jacket handy for sudden showers. The quiet tropics ease worry, but check my updates for storm timing. Embrace the wet warmth indoors with a fan or plan outdoor fun around the rain, but remember when thunder roars go INDOORS!



## **Weather Safety**

Safety Tip of The Week: During thunderstorms, unplug electronics to avoid surges, Florida's lightning can strike nearby anytime!

## **Hurricane Preparedness Tip of**

the Week: This tip may seem like common sense, but you may be surprised at how many people don't own closed toe shoes in Florida! Always make sure you have closed toe shoes readily available for when you do have to go outside during and/or after the storm.

## Boating & Beach Report

Best Beach Day: This week will be a little tougher as far as the best beach day goes due to the tropical moisture that will be present. Your best bet would be generally earlier in the day than later this week for the beach. Keep an eye on the sky and stay tuned for my radar updates as needed!

Best Boating Day: Offshore & nearshore boating doesn't look good for most of this week due to the tropical rains expected across much of the Gulf and near the coast. If planning to go out be cautious and be prepared if caught in nasty storms. Seas will range between 1 and 4 feet for many of the weekdays with things calming by the weekend.

## **Surf Report**

**Best Surf Day:** There will be some surf this week with the best days looking to be today (Monday), where 2-3 footers are possible. On Wednesday we could see seas range up to 4 feet at times with 2-3 footers on Thursday.

It was designated the state flower in 1909 by the Florida legislature.
