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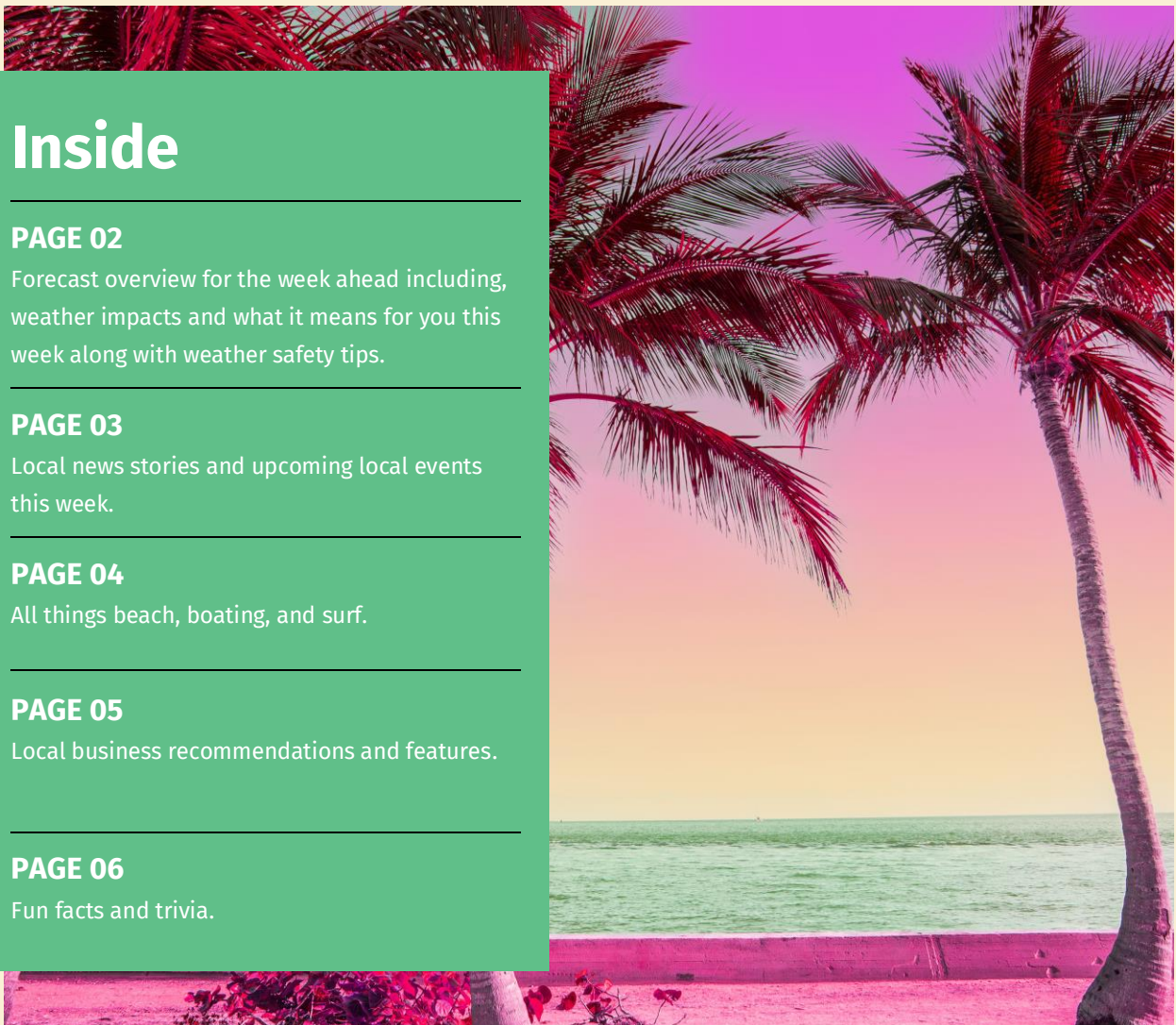

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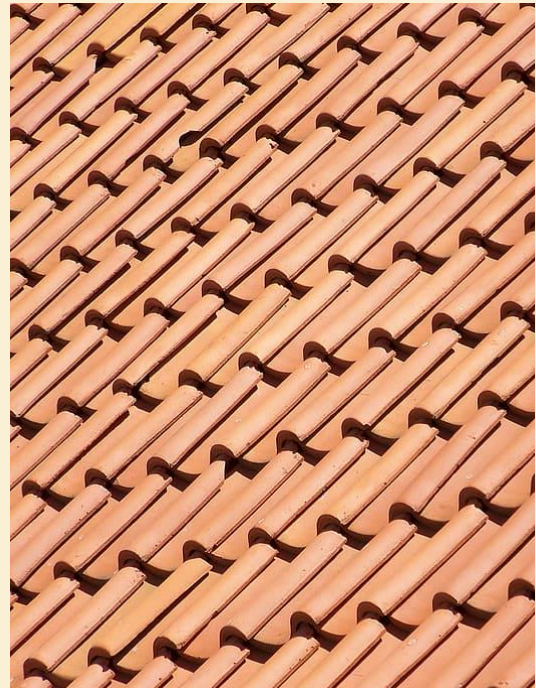
This Week's Weather

Overview

This week's weather will be the tail of two seasons! We start the week off on the dry and mostly sunny side and then end it off on a typical summer-like rainy season pattern. We will also have a period of more cloudy weather starting by the middle of this week through the end of the week. The good news is that we have officially begun to see a very slight drop in dew point temperatures this past week which will continue through the beginning of this week making it feel SLIGHTLY more comfortable during the morning hours. Unfortunately, dew points gradually increase again by middle to end of this week. Overall, expect temps in the mid-upper 80s°F. For detailed daily weather forecasts check my Facebook page & website.

Weather Impacts: What It Means for You

This Week: Kick off with dry, sunny mornings, perfect for a Venice Beach walk or early chores around the house, feeling a tad less sticky with lower dew points. Midweek brings clouds and a shift to rainy season vibes yet again. Keep a raincoat handy for afternoon showers and storms possible and check my updates for timing. By week's end, rising dew points make it muggier again, so hydrate at the Venice Farmer's Market over the weekend and use a fan at home. Temps in the mid-upper 80s suit a shaded picnic at Centennial Park, but plan indoor backups as storms return. Enjoy the taste of Fall during the beginning of this week!

Safety Tip of The Week: After a thunderstorm with strong winds and heavy rains, be sure to check your roof for loose shingles. Wind can loosen them, which as a result could cause leakage problems down the road. It's best to catch this early before it gets worse!

Boating & Beach Report

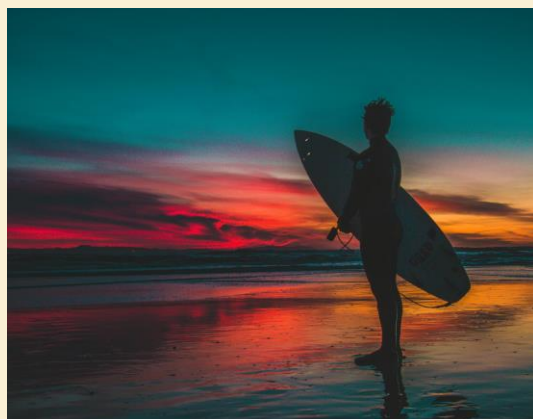
Best Beach Day: The best beach days this week will be today (Monday) and Tuesday where we'll have plenty of sunshine and dry conditions expected for the most part! For the rest of the week our typical rainy season pattern returns with chances for showers and thunderstorms each day.

Best Boating Day: Offshore boating looks good for today (Monday) and Tuesday where 1 foot or less seas are expected. From Wednesday through the remainder of the week expect seas to range from 1 to 3 feet at times, but overall, nothing significant. Wind speeds will range between the 10-20 mph range. Nearshore boating looks great all week long. Otherwise, no other significant weather hazards of concern are expected this week.

Surf Report

Best Surf Day: This week we are not expecting any significant or beginner surf likely at the time of writing this.

Did you know?

There are no dinosaur fossils in Florida!

Due to Florida being underwater during the age of the dinosaurs there have not been any dinosaur fossils found in surface deposits. During the Triassic, Jurassic, and Cretaceous periods, the Florida landmass was largely underwater. While some areas of northern Florida may have been above sea level, the rocks that would contain dinosaur fossils are now buried deep beneath the surface.
